Course abstract: The course is designed for bachelor's study program "Philology" students. Traditional course includes questions about the parts of speech classification, grammatical categories, declination and conjugation types, morphology and syntax relations. Course objectives: To introduce students to the modern Russian language morphological system; to characterize contemporary Russian peculiarities of parts of speech, lexical grammatical categories, their trends; to develop morphological analysis skills.

Learning outcomes:

Course plan / Contents:
Course structure: Lectures - 8 hrs., Seminars - 8 hours. Lecture topics: 1. The word meaning and its types. Grammatical categories and its types.

2. Word class characteristics and their distribution principles. Word class classification (Л.В.Щерба, В.В.Виноградов).
3. Noun. Noun lexical grammatical categories.
4. Noun grammatical categories.

Seminar topics:

1. Noun meaning. Proper names and general. Animated / noanimated category.
2. Noun grammatical categories - gender, number, case.
3. Noun case system.
4. Noun declination types.

Students' independent work:

- theory studies;
- practical work.
