Course summary	The course introduces the concepts and categories of policy (politics, government, political system, copper, etc.), the theoretical problems of scientific research methods and methodological approaches. In addition to providing information on Latvian, Lithuanian, Belarusian and Russian political system, regime, political culture, as well as performed reālpolitiskās analysis of the situation.
Results	Students gaining knowledge in political science and Eastern Europe, topical issues of real politics: 1. get acquainted with comparative political science basic categories of development stages and the main tasks; 2. are able to analytically and critically judge the international and regional political developments, discussing the contemporary political actualities; 3. to know national foreign and internal external and internal factors influencing; 4. are able to express and defend opinions constantly being developed through academic and other sources; 5. are able to discuss national personality pole politics and individual place in the political process.

10. Types of ideology (nationalism, "ecologism", "without - ideological" ideology). State ideology. State analysis of ideology.
11. Political regimes and their typology. Political regimes in Poland, Belarus, Russia, Latvian and Lithuania - Characteristics and comparative analysis.
12. Political system. The political elements of the system. The political system in Poland, Belarus, Russia, Latvian and Lithuania. Economics and politics.
13. Copper political system. Power phenomenon. Political power.
14. Political power legitimacy. Power structure. Political power resources (funds).
15. Political culture. Political cultural elements. Political cultural paradigm in Latvia, Lithuania, Russia and Belarus.
16. Introduction to geopolitics. Geopolitics and realpolitik. Global and regional organizations: EU, NATO, the CIS, Shanghai organization, etc.
