Normative grammar I-III (B)
Course abstract:
The course is envisaged for the students of Bachelor study programme “Philology”. The course includes the topics concerning the classification of the parts of speech, their grammatical categories, declination types, relations between morphology and syntax.

Course content:

Transitive and non-transitive verbs. Active and passive. Verb two bases and their role in verb-formation. Verb classes. Verb mode. Subjunctive and imperative. Expression of reality. Personal category. Declinable participle as a special form of the verb. Undeclinable participle as a special form of the verb.
Course plan:

Seminar topics:

1. The declension system of nouns. Noun declension types.
2. Declination of substantive and adjective nouns.
3. Full-form and short-form adjectives.
4. Comparative degrees.
5. Adjective declension types.
6. Gender category of numerals. Number category of numerals. Numeral declension category. Declination of numerals.
7. Role of different categories of pronouns, morphological character, changes in word-formation, syntactic functions.
8. Imperfectivation and perfectivation. Pairs of verbs by type. Uniform, double-form verbs.
9. The verbs of motion.
10. Tense category. Imperfective verb forms of the present tense and their meanings. Imperfective verb forms of the past and future tenses and their meanings. Perfective verb forms of the past and future tenses and their meanings.
11. Meanings of personal form. Impersonal verbs.
12. Verb conjugation.

Students' independent work:

- work with literature and periodicals: theoretical etc. indicated literature and periodicals, research and analysis;
- preparation for colloquia, seminars, practical classes;
- specific practical tasks (word morphological analysis).

Requirements for awarding credit points:

Students term evaluation: Home works (20%) 2 tests (40%), examination (40%).
