Course developer

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Study course abstract

The course is designed for the students of Bachelor program "East European culture and business relations". This course is intended for studying the peculiarities of the Russian spoken language. The course aims to develop students' skills to grammatically correctly express their thoughts in Russian, within the range of the given themes in different communication situations; to enrich their vocabulary and improve communicative skills.

Course plan

Seminars - 64 h.

1. The student must be able to express the necessary communicative intentions in communicative situations:

- studies (the Dean's Office, classroom, examination, etc.);
- in a shop, market;
- in the post office, bank;
- in a canteen, café, restaurant;
- transport, in the streets;
- in a theater, museum, on excursions;
- at the chemist's, the doctor's, in the health center;

2. The student must be able to orally communicate within the framework of the themes as follows :

- a story about oneself; biography: childhood, training, interests;
- my friend (my acquaintance, family member);
- family;
- learning foreign languages;
- my work day, my daily plan;
- leisure, recreation, hobby;
- hometown, the capital;
- health;
- weather.

3. Content of language competence:

- Phonetics and graphics.
- Grammar. The gender and number of the noun. Case system. The meaning and usage of cases.
- The adjective. The agreement between adjectives and nouns. Case system.
- Pronouns. Personal, interrogative, possessive, demonstrative pronouns.
- The verb. The verb type. Present, past and future.
- The government of the verb.
- The imperative mood.
- The numeral. The use of the numeral with the noun.
- Prepositions, conjunctions.
- A simple sentence.
- A compound sentence.

Students' independent work:

- Work on literature and periodicals: studying and analysis of the given theoretical and other literature and periodicals ;
- Getting ready for seminars, practical classes;
- Fulfilment of specific practical assignments;
- Tasks on conversational Russian;
- Enrichment of the vocabulary; • Studying of theoretical material.

Learning outcomes

Having mastered the course, students are able to:

- positively communicate in different communicative situations;
- successfully use the acquired communicative skills in the Russian language;
- individually acquire the appropriate vocabulary on a wider range of topics;
- clearly and intelligibly express their opinion; • formulate their ideas and substantiate their views.
